CPR/AED/NARCAN TRAINING

The Westerlo Town Board passed a resolution on September 20th to rent three automated external defibrillator (AED) machines to be housed at the Town Hall, Highway Department and Justice Court. The rental cost is \$349 per unit per year and will be fully maintained by the providing company. Now that the Town has these state-of-the-art AED machines, you're probably wondering who will be trained to operate them.

The Confidential Administrator organized a hands-on training session on December 7th for any employee who signed up for CPR, AED, and Narcan training. Training was provided by Patrick Kervin, EMT-P, ALS, Education Coordinator from the Albany County Sheriff's Department of Emergency Medical Services Unit. The training was very well received by the 21 employees who attended and are now all fully certified!

The initial costs for training were covered by Albany County Sheriff's and any additional costs associated with recertification will be the Town's responsibility but an expense that is absolutely worth it. These things save lives and it's so great that so many employees expressed an interest in learning.

Thank you to the Supervisor's office, specifically Lisa DeGroff for setting all of this up, to Albany County Sheriff's for covering the costs, the trainers and all the Town employees who took the time to be a part of this monumental day.

From the Supervisor's Desk



The Holidays are behind us, and we are full steam ahead into 2024. I would like to take a few moments to highlight some of the Town's accomplishments in 2023. First, I would like to report that we are financially strong, and we

were able to keep our standard operating costs below the anticipated 2023 budget. This will allow us to roll all unused funds into their respective fund balances in order to continue to build the Town's financial reserves. With nearly 2.4 million in reserve funding, we anticipate setting aside 1.2 million for capital improvements to the Towns infrastructure. This funding will allow for much needed improvements to our parks, buildings, and equipment. Listed below are some of the highlights of 2023. Let's make 2024 another financially strong year for the Town of Westerlo.

- Current capital improvement projects are in process at both the Town Hall and Highway Department.
- We are setting aside 1.2 million of the current 2.4 million fund balance to be used for capital improvement projects for Town facilities and replacement of aging equipment over the next four years. The multiyear financial plan and multiyear capital improvement plans are essentially financial roadmaps for financial planning and town wide improvements over the next four years.
- We are hoping in the near future to transfer 3 acres of vacant land that sits behind Town Hall to the Westerlo Fire Company so that they can build a new Fire Station to serve the Town of Westerlo. The transfer of land is a tax benefit and cost savings for residents.
- The Town has also received several grants for projects and initiatives. One of those projects is making our Local Laws current and searchable on an online platform. The Town of Westerlo will receive a \$10,000 grant to cover the expense of the review and codification of our Town laws.
- Restoration of the Basic Creek along Veterans Memorial Park has been completed and financed with grant funding from Albany County Soil and Water. Thank you to our highway department for all their restoration efforts. Our park is now better protected from further erosion and flooding along the Basic Creek. The Town has been awarded \$35,000 in grant funding for the completion of this project.
- A Senior Lunch and Learn series was initiated by the Supervisor's Office, in partnership with the Hilltowns' Community Resource Center. The programs address topics of interest for seniors in our community and provide a free lunch. In addition, seniors have an opportunity to socialize with their neighbors.
- The Town held several community events in 2023. Pictures with the Easter Bunny, The Annual Fall Festival, and Tree Lighting were coordinated by the Town Clerks Office along with volunteers

Town Clerk's Corner

Fishing, hunting and marriage licenses may be obtained at the office of the Town Clerk, 933 County Route 401. The Town Clerk's office also issues dog licenses, parking permits for persons with disabilities, Certificates of Residence, transfer station permits (residents only), birth/death/marriage certificates and copies of vital records. They can also assist with genealogy searches, Freedom of Information (FOIL) requests as well as free notary services. Acceptable forms of payment include: cash, check, money order, credit/debit card. ***Please note: there's a fee for credit/debit cards however, they're NOT accepted for NYS DEC transactions***

NEW INFORMATION

- The Clerk's office is responsible for updating the website and hopes to have a historian page available soon.
- Keep in mind, park reservations can only be reserved up to 1 year in advance. Make sure to call us soon if you would like to make a reservation. Dates book up quickly.
 Applications and a list of fees can be found on our website.
- Just a reminder that Town of Westerlo Property Tax bills were mailed out the first week of January. Bills can be paid without penalty through January 31st. There is a 1% penalty if paid February 1st through February 29th and a 2% penalty if paid March 1st through April 1st. You can submit payment by mail, in person, or at the Bank of Greene County (Westerlo or Greenville branches only)! More tax information is available on the Town's website. If you have questions about back taxes, please contact Albany County Department of Finance at (518) 447-7082. They will have the most up-to-date information.
- If you are mailing tax payments, it's recommended that
 you ask the post office to post mark the envelope with a
 date stamp before mailing, as the date on the envelope, is
 the date used to determine penalties. Please note, we do
 not accept metered mail date stamps for tax payments.
 Mail sent with a metered machine will be accepted the day
 the mail is received in this office, not the date on the
 envelope. Please call if you have questions.

To apply, pick up an application at the Transfer Station, Town Clerk's Office or print one from our website! If you need one mailed, please call us at (518) 797-3111 opt. 2.

Thanks to Highway Superintendent Jody Ostrander, as of December 19th, there is no longer a cost to dispose of televisions, monitors, washers, dryers, stoves or hot water heaters at the transfer station.

News from the Assessor

- Any property owner turning 65 years old this year may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR exemption.
 The March 1st exemption deadline does not apply in some instances. Contact the Assessor for more information!
- The Assessor will continue to drive around town to take pictures of new structures when a Certificate of Occupancy has been issued to building permit holders. There will be a Town of Westerlo magnetic sign on the side of the vehicle used to accomplish this task. Do not hesitate to contact the Assessor's office if you have any questions.
- The Assessor's regular office hours are Thursdays from 4:30 pm to 7 pm however, this does not mean she is not in the office other times. The set hours from 4:30 pm to 7 pm are for the public to come to this office for assistance without an appointment. Please contact the Assessor if you need to make an appointment outside the set hours. Voicemail messages are checked daily, and calls will be returned promptly. In most circumstances, calls are returned when the Assessor is in the office so that she can reference information only available at the office.
- The 2023 Final Assessment Roll was filed on July 1,
 2023. It can be viewed on the Town's website.
- Reminder: Can your house #'s be seen? This is very important for emergency services!

The Assessor's office has been busy preparing for the upcoming property tax bills. We are also preparing to mail exemption renewal forms which will be due back to the Assessor's office by March 1, 2024. The income levels for the Enhanced STAR; Aged-All (Low Income Seniors); and Disabled with Limited Income have been raised. If you were denied any of these exemptions in the past, you may now be eligible. Contact the Assessor's office for an exemption application form if you feel you may now be eligible.

Local Law Review Committee


Farmers Market

Westerlo History

As Town historian, my job is to make local history accessible and interesting to the community. Every historian has taken on their own points of interest during their appointment years. This can be seen in Dennis Fancher's interest in military history, Bob Duchow's interest in genealogies, Junior Bishop's documentation of every known cemetery in Westerlo (amongst lots of other contributions)!

What will be my contribution? Well, I'll tell you! I've been working with Town Clerk, Karla Weaver, for close to a year now to establish a "Westerlo History Tab" on our Town website. This will be a place we can all go to view (and share) old pictures of people and places in Westerlo's past. We will also be able to view maps dated back to 1854 and 1866 as well as more current maps. It will also feature an online library of sorts that will include digitized copies of Junior Bishops volumes of local cemetery inscriptions. These books have been a wealth of information for the last 3+ decades in hard copy form at the library and in the Town Clerk's office. Now they will be available for the whole world to see!

The site will also feature the invaluable works of Margaretta "Peg" Tozer. She was never a Town historian but did extensive genealogical research compiling her findings in scrapbooks that I have digitized and will make available through this site. Peg would research a Westerlo family and write their complete multi-generational genealogy including pictures, newspaper articles, wedding invitations and anything else she collected. The Hannay book alone includes at least 50 other Westerlo families!

I have been working very hard over the last few years to take Junior's data and build out the cemeteries on an Ancestry.com site called FindAGrave.com. I've located and built out over 40 Westerlo cemeteries thus far and will provide links on the website to each cemetery which also features (or will in the future) generational links which will eventually replace the need for Bishops 7 volume set. This will not only allow the whole world to be able to access all of that data, but it also allows for anyone knowledgeable of their own family history to update it directly!

We're hoping to have the ability to be able to query a database that town resident Susan Cunningham has created where you can simply put in your family name (i.e. Hannay) and it will list all family members buried in town as well as the location of their burial. I hope this encourages our community to revisit their ancestry and figure out the link between the different generations. I also hope that as the community spends more time looking up their ancestor's we will all take more interest in better maintaining our more than 70 cemeteries in town.

I hope for this site to be an impetus for more interaction with the community because we all hold pieces of Westerlo history, some for our few years here and some for generations! How cool would it be to dust off those old photos or written family history to share with the whole town through this future site! So be on the lookout for this new tab! I'm certain that there will be something of interest for everyone in town!

Disposal of Used Motor Oil



United Tenants of Albany, Inc. (UTA)



Expanded In-Home Services to the Elderly Program (EISEP)

What is EISEP?

The program is for Albany County seniors 60+ years of age, who need assistance with activities of daily living. An assessment will determine if the person is eligible. Seniors who are eligible to receive similar services under Medicare, Medicaid, or other government services, are not eligible for EISEP.

Will there be a cost?

The initial assessment for EISEP is free regardless of income. EISEP is a cost share program. Cost is determined by the senior's monthly income and specific housing deductions. The cost can range from no cost to a specific per hour charge. Case management is provided free of charge.

Am I eligible?

To arrange for an assessment, call (518) 447-7177. A caseworker will take the identifying information. The case will then be assigned to a caseworker. The senior will be contacted so an appointment can be set up in their home.

EPIC

The Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) program is a New York State program for seniors administered by the Department of Health. It helps more than 325,000 income-eligible seniors aged 65 and older to supplement their out-of-pocket Medicare Part D drug plan costs. Seniors can apply for EPIC **at any time of the year** and must be enrolled or eligible to be enrolled in a Medicare Part D drug plan to receive EPIC benefits and maintain coverage.

EPIC provides secondary coverage for Medicare Part D and EPIC-covered drugs purchased after **any Medicare Part D deductible is met**. EPIC also covers approved Part D-excluded drugs once a member is enrolled in Part D.

EPIC helps pay the <u>Medicare Part D drug plan premiums</u> for members with income up to \$23,000 if single or \$29,000 if married. Higher income members are required to pay their own Part D premiums, but EPIC provides premium assistance by lowering their EPIC deductible.

EPIC has two plans based on income. The <u>Fee Plan</u> is for members with income up to \$20,000 if single or \$26,000 if married. The <u>Deductible Plan</u> is for members with incomes ranging from \$20,001 to \$75,000 if single or \$26,001 to \$100,000 if married.

It is easy to join the program. Just complete the application and mail or fax it to EPIC. No documentation is required. EPIC verifies information with the Social Security Administration and the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance.

Legal Counseling and Assistance

The program is staffed by the **Legal Aid Society of Northeastern New York Inc.** The attorney provides advice and representation and/or referrals as appropriate to Albany County seniors age 60+. The attorney may assist on a variety of legal topics including: Social Security, SSI, Pensions, Medicare, Nursing or Adult Home Issues, Food Stamps, Medicaid, Utilities/HEAP, Tenants Issues, Home Repair & Consumer Fraud, Grandparents' Rights, Financial Abuse, and Elder Abuse.

Group presentations are given at Albany County senior centers and congregate sites; topics include: wills, powers of attorney, health care proxies, and estate matters. (The attorney does not provide direct representation on these issues.)


