After years of hearing concerns from residents regarding the disrepair and blight of a home in the center of Town, the Westerlo Town Board and Code Enforcement Officer in cooperation with Albany County were able to proceed to demolish this abandoned residence. Code Enforcement Officer, Jeff Pine, deemed the structure "unsafe" which allowed the Town to be able to navigate the numerous steps necessary to have the building torn down in March. ### From the Supervisor's Desk



Westerlo is off to a great start in 2024! I am pleased to report that the Town has collected property taxes to fund our 2024 budget. This means we are not starting the year behind and can proceed as planned with the approved budget.

In addition, with the approval of the Capital Projects Reserve Fund by the Town Board we are now able to allocate \$1.2 million toward the repair and improvement of our Town buildings. Staying ahead of maintenance and repair for major projects is important so that we can keep costs down by not having to address emergencies but rather take care of projects in advance.

In addition, I am pleased that our Town has such devoted and dedicated residents who continue to volunteer their time for the benefit of our residents. Our Local Law review committee is getting closer to presenting their recommendations to the Town Board. What this means is that after approval and recommendations by the Town Board our Local Laws can be updated to be relevant for our community, comply with state statutes, reduce redundancy, and once complete, be uploaded to a searchable website for all residents, contractors, and Town employees.

Our Museum Committee continues to plan events for the community. They have once again organized a Mother's Day Brunch and Town-wide Garage Sale. Furthermore, planning has begun to erect an additional building where the museum is located for storing the historical artifacts of our Town. The museum is now open the first Saturday of every month, April – November. Stop in and see our history!

The Westerlo Hometown Heroes Committee is in the process of producing the 2024 banners. I am hopeful that with schedules and weather permitting these banners will be displayed by Memorial Day. They have also set the dates for the annual Closing Ceremony, Saturday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> and the Veterans' Day Sunset Service, Monday November 11<sup>th</sup>. In addition, once the weather warms up, they will be weeding, mulching, and planting flowers in Veterans' Garden, located in the Veterans' Memorial Park. They always welcome volunteers!

Veteran services continue to be an area we are developing. We already began to offer residents an opportunity to meet with representatives from Albany County Veteran Services once a month. We have now added to this monthly program, offering coffee and pastries to Veterans' wishing to socialize with each other at this monthly event. In addition, we will be adding representatives from the VA whenever possible.

Speaking of volunteers, the Citizens Committee for Park Improvement has resumed meetings to address items to be repaired, replaced, updated, and added to both parks. They have planned for a community-

Fishing, hunting and marriage licenses may be obtained at the office of the Town Clerk, 933
County Route 401. The Town Clerk's office also issues dog licenses, parking permits for persons with disabilities, Certificates of Residence, transfer station permits (residents only), birth/death/marriage certificates and copies of vital records. They can also assist with genealogy searches, Freedom of Information (FOIL) requests as well as free notary services. Acceptable forms of payment include: cash, check, money order, credit/debit card. \*\*\*Please note: there's a fee for credit/debit cards however, they're NOT accepted for NYS DEC transactions\*\*\*

### **News from the Assessor**

- exemption deadline for new and renewal applications. They will be examined for eligibility in the coming weeks. Updates to our system will begin in preparation for the May 1<sup>st</sup> tentative roll deadline. A notice will be placed on the Town's website, in a local newspaper, and on the Clerk's bulletin board at the Town Hall regarding the filing of the 2024 tentative roll and information regarding this year's Board of Assessment Review grievance hearings that are scheduled to be held on Wednesday, May 29, 2024, from 4 pm to 8 pm in the Assessor's office. This is pending the public hearing regarding proposed local law No 1 of 2024 on April 16<sup>th</sup>.
- The Assessor will continue to drive around town to take pictures of new structures when a Certificate of Occupancy has been issued to building permit holders. There will be a Town of Westerlo magnetic sign on the side of the vehicle used to accomplish this task. Do not hesitate to contact the Assessor's office if you have any questions.
- The Assessor's regular office hours are Thursdays from 4:30 pm to 7 pm however, this does not mean she is not in the office other times. The set hours from 4:30 pm to 7 pm are for the public to come to this office for assistance without an appointment. Please contact the Assessor if you need to make an appointment outside the set hours. Voicemail messages are checked daily, and calls will be returned promptly. In most circumstances, calls are returned when the Assessor is in the office so that she can reference information only available at the office.
- The 2023 Final Assessment Roll was filed on July 1, 2023. It can be viewed on the Town's website.
- Reminder: Can your house #'s be seen? This is very important for emergency services!

### **Westerlo History**

Spring 2024 Westerlo History Article on ANCESTRY.COM Genealogy holds LOTS of data concerning who we are, where we came from, and who helped forge that path. Our library received a grant last year and purchased a one-year subscription (US and International) of ANCESTRY.COM. They also have multiple laptops that can be used at the library during open hours. Feel free to bring your own laptop so you can download your findings. The library offers free WIFI which reaches all the way out to the parking lot! This is your chance to do some family research without having to pay for online services! Luckily, the town library has secured another grant to pay for one more year of Ancestry.com! This is great news!!

What is ANCESTRY.COM? It's the largest for-profit genealogy company in the world! It houses over 30 BILLION records of US and International origin and over 100 million family trees! 30 BILLION RECORDS, 100 million trees (That bears repeating)!! A sampling of data includes census records, birth, marriage and death records, military records (draft, enlistment, casualties, and prisoner rolls), church records, cemetery records, immigration records, ship manifests, land records, court records, wills and probate, newspaper articles, even pictures and maps! I'm warning you, it's addictive! AND it's at the Westerlo Library for your FREE use!

To promote more use of it I have started running basic Ancestry.com classes at the library once a month. The purpose of these classes is to show everyone where and how to start so that they can utilize this resource on their own and uncover their family histories for themselves. It truly is like a treasure hunt on a computer! You can even download documents onto your own laptops or bring a USB drive if you're borrowing a library laptop!

So, come to the library and try Ancestry.com! It's also a fun way of getting to know other people in town! It's absolutely FREE for another year. I think you'll be amazed at what treasures you can find on your family! I've traced my bloodline back to the 1300's!! It also prompted a family trip to Scotland this past September to locate the Hannay ancestral home built in 1090!

## Hilltown Community Resource Center


Happy Spring! The Hilltown Community Resource Center has been busy. Food pantries are up 30% this winter which is no surprise with the cost of food and necessities.







The Albany Pine Bush Preserve is open year-round with free admission and is an excellent place to go cross-country skinning in Albany. It features approximately 20 miles of multi-use trails that are marked and considered easy to moderate. Although trails aren't groomed, many skiers use the preserve. Snowshoers are also welcome, but they should stay to the sides of the ski tracks as a courtesy to other visitors.

April 17<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 pm – Woodcock Walk (for ages 8+): Walk through the Pine Bush to watch the elaborate flight displays of the American Woodcock. The woodcock is a chucky little bird with a short neck, long bill and big eyes set high in a large head. Males perform amazing flight displays at dusk in the spring. Start inside with a presentation and continue outside for a .9 mile hike. This program meets inside the Discovery Center. Suggested donation: \$5.00, please register online.

April 23<sup>rd</sup> @ 7:30 pm – Full Moon Hike at Blueberry Hill West (for tweens, teens, and adults): Enjoy the Pine Bush at night under a full moon. Meet at the Blueberry Hill West trailhead (#5). Suggested donation: \$5.00, please register online.

May 10<sup>th</sup> @ 4 pm – Nature Night Out (for all ages): This is a series of evening events that invite everyone to drop everything and get into nature. The Albany Pine Bush Discovery Center will extend operations until 7:30 pm on each of these days, capitalizing on those longer sunlit hours. Visitors can enjoy live music while feasting on a meal from food truck vendors, go on a StoryWalk adventure along the trail and learn about the natural & cultural history of the Pine Bush with interactive Discovery Center exhibits.

May 18<sup>th</sup> @ 10 am – 12 pm – Native Plant Sale: Looking for native pine barrens plants for your home landscape? Stop by the Discovery Center and purchase native pine barrens plants from the Schenectady County Cornell Cooperative Extension Master Gardeners and the students of Farnsworth Middle School. Purchases will support the work of the Cornell Cooperative Extension Master Gardeners and the Butterfly Station at Farnsworth Middle School.

May 25<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 pm – Drop-In Bird Banding Observation: See wild birds up close and personal as Albany Pine Bush scientists capture them and fit them with uniquely coded leg-bands. Bands are provided by the US Geological Society to licensed bird banders so scientists can identify individuals; this allows us to study how long birds live, where they breed and when and where they migrate. While in-hand, the banders carefully take measurements that can indicate a bird's health, age, and breeding condition. This information is used to evaluate the health of bird populations and the habitats they rely on during the breeding and non-breeding season. Tracking the distribution and abundance of species that specialize on our fire-dependent inland pitch pine-scrub oak barrens can also help guide the management and restoration of this globally rare habitat.

June 5<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 pm – Community Science: FrogWatch Volunteer Training (for tweens, teens, and adults - children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult): this is an online training. Register online. This will provide an introduction to FrogWatch, a community science program of the Akron Zoo. Volunteers will then train to become certified FrogWatchers. through August. Listen to and report frogs & toads calling in the APBP study area. Forms must be completed online.

June 26<sup>th</sup> @ 7 pm – Community Science: National Butterfly Count Volunteer Training (for adults): this is an online training. Register online. Learn what butterflies can be found in the APBP & how you can participate in the 2024 National Butterfly count. Volunteers will spend a day working together with a leader to document & record butterflies in the preserve. This event will occur entirely online.

### **Home Delivered Meals**

The Home-Delivered Meal program provides balanced meals to eligible adults aged 60 or older, and spouse regardless of age, delivered right to their home. The homedelivered meal service may be temporary or long term.

The home-delivered program gives priority to the following target groups who have the greatest economic and social needs: minorities, low-income, frail, and vulnerable elderly aged 60 and older.

- Is incapacitated due to accident, illness, or frailty.
- Lacks support of family, friends, or neighbors; and
- Is unable to prepare meals due to a lack of inadequacy of facilities, such as refrigeration, stove, etc., inability to shop, cook or prepare meals safely, or lack of knowledge or skills.

Our registered dietitian ensures that all meals comply with the Older Americans Act and Nutrition Program Standards. Each balanced meal provides essential nutrients with focus on whole grains, fruits and vegetables, lean proteins, and low-fat dairy. Meals are also limited in sodium, saturated fats, and added sugars. Please be advised that therapeutic/special diets and modified consistencies are not accommodated through this program. Persons that have a known significant food allergy are unable to participate in this program.

The home-delivered meal program provides an opportunity for suggested voluntary contribution toward the service which helps expand services.


