- RENAME THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO "PLANNING BOARD/ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS.
- 4. AMEND THE TOWN OF WESTERLO CODE WHERE NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THESE CHANGES.

The Town of Westerlo Town Board held a Special Town Board Meeting on Friday, June 28, 2024, at the Westerlo Town Hall at 933 County Route 401, Westerlo, NY at 6 PM for a vote on proposed Local Law # 3 of 2024.

Supervisor Kryzak lead off with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Supervisor Kryzak welcomed everyone to the Special Town Board Meeting which he advised was for the purpose of voting on proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2024. He announced before the Board voted he was going to take everyone through the Short Environmental Assessment form Part 1 and Part 2. He mentioned, this is a belt and suspenders approach to make sure they dot their I's and cross their T's. The Supervisor did not open the Town Board meeting.

## PROPOSED LL#3-2024 SEQRA-SHORT FORM Part 1, 2, & 3

Supervisor Kryzak mentioned the first page for the Board to look at is the Short Environmental Assessment form Part 1. Supervisor Kryzak then read question 1: Does the proposed action only involve the legislative adoption of a plan, local law, ordinance administrative rule, or regulation. Supervisor Kryzak advised the answer is yes. Part 2 -Short Environmental form - Impact Assessment was next. Supervisor Kryzak mentioned for questions 1 through 11 the answers were no, for all eleven. He indicated there was no environmental harm or anything like that being done. With that being said, he mentioned what he was essentially doing was moving to make a motion. He motioned to the Town

Board that at the top of the printed resolution, they should make sure the date has been corrected it is not supposed to be July 2, 2024, it is supposed to be June 28, 2024, at 6:00 PM. He advised he had inked that change. Supervisor Kryzak then read aloud and made the following resolution:

**RESOLVED:** 

- 1. The Town Board is the lead agency under SEQRA, and the adoption of proposed Local Law #3 of 2024 will not result in a significant adverse impact on the environment.
- 2. The attached Negative Declaration, incorporated herein by reference, is issued and adopted for the reasons stated in the attached Negative Declaration, and Parts 1, 2, and 3 of the Environmental Assessment Form are also incorporated herein by reference.
- **3.** The Supervisor of the Town of Westerlo is authorized to sign and file or have filed on behalf of the Town all documents necessary to comply with SEQRA.

Councilwoman Burnside seconded the motion, a roll call vote resulted as follows:

## **ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW NO. 3-2024**

Town Attorney McHugh advised Councilwoman Burnside that she had to read the proposed resolution to adopt Local Law No. 3 of 2024. Councilwoman Burnside read aloud and offered the following resolution (see attached):

local law; and

adjacent to the Town of Westerlo borders; and

**WHEREAS:** the proposed local law was forwarded to the Albany County Planning Board for

their review and recommendations, a copy of which is attached hereto; and
