# Beloved Highway Superintendent retires after 30.5 years!

After 30 ½ years of service to the Town of Westerlo, Highway Superintendent Jody Ostrander is officially retiring! Over these many years, Jody has been a real asset to our treasured Town and the surrounding area for many reasons. At this time, we would like to honor and highlight a few of Jody's extraordinary accomplishments as an employee for 23 years and Superintendent for the past seven years.

First, we would be remiss to only say that Jody has been an instrumental benefit in Westerlo because of his exceptional leadership but he should be recognized for his handling of many remarkable feats, such as in guiding the Town through multiple natural disasters and even an unprecedented pandemic!

During his time as Superintendent, Jody completed the stream bank erosion project where he had to assist the Town with applying and ultimately receiving grants for the project, not only once but twice! Following Winter Storm Stella on March 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017, Jody was responsible for submitting FEMA paperwork for reimbursement after the Town had spent an unexpectedly large amount of money for the cleanup of the community. For several years now, he and his crew have generously hung the Hometown Heros banners throughout town and he oversaw clearing for Dig Safes for the water system.

As for his time during the COVID-19 pandemic, Jody not only worked 7 days a week, operated the transfer station, hauled garbage to Albany landfill but also took care of his normal Superintendent duties without the regular assistance from his staff and with no complaints.

On top of all these numerous tasks, Jody has served the Town for 17 years as the driver of the emergency vehicles for EMS and the Fire Company along with

# From the Supervisor's Desk



There are so many positive things happening in Westerlo right now that I don't know where to begin. Here are just a few.

As I mentioned in our previous newsletter, the Town has started a Capital Projects Improvement Plan and set aside money in a

special reserve fund. I am pleased to announce we are off and running and will soon be replacing the roofs on the Justice Court and Town Hall. Staying ahead of maintenance and repair is crucial to preserving the Town's assets.

Park Clean Up Day was a success. Volunteers gathered and painted all four dugouts and picnic tables at the Blaisdell White Memorial Park as well as picking up trash strewn about. Volunteers at Veterans Memorial Park spread mulch and planted flowers as well as dug out the horseshoe pits. Many thanks to the volunteers, especially those who came from the Bank of Greene County! At some point over the summer the park employees and highway department will be installing new swings, a new slide, and a new set of bleachers and basketball nets in the Blaisdell White Memorial Park. A toddler swing and wheelchair swing and new basketball nets will be installed in Veterans Memorial Park. We are also actively working on a plan to re-do the tennis courts. The "remodel" will include one tennis court, one pickleball court along with new posts and nets.

The opportunity for our Hilltown seniors to socialize, hear a guest speaker and enjoy a free meal at our Town's Lunch and Learn series – co-hosted by the Hilltowns Community Resource Center – continues to be a tremendous success. The programs planned for the summer include July - Wills, Trusts and Estate Planning, August - Veteran Suicide Prevention, September - Planning for a Funeral/Memorial Service and Purchasing a Burial Plot and October - Navigating Medicare Enrollment. Thanks for organizing this lecture series go to Confidential Administrator, Lisa DeGroff and Marybeth Peterson, Director, Hilltowns Community Resource Center. Our veteran services in Westerlo is going strong! taking on the job of Dog Control Officer (DCO) for 15 years' time!

Over the years, Jody has been dedicated to saving the Town money where he can, for example: he was able to piggyback off other awarded contracts; he suggested the Town Board create an equipment fund for new vehicles to be purchased regularly to keep the burden from being transferred to the taxpayers; instead of projects being hired out to contract companies, Jody and his staff have done many in-house renovations and mechanical work on vehicles. In fact, when the Town Hall was purchased and needed to be converted from its original school setting to an office/meeting space, Jody and his team were able to complete all the upgrades necessary along with those needed at the Highway Department and Court facilities.

More recently, Jody has been heavily involved and extremely supportive of all Town events and functions. He is always willing to lend a hand and assist however is needed; whether that be bringing big trucks down for Fall Festival for kids to explore, sending staff to help decorate or being there for the planning, set up and clean up afterward.

As Superintendent, Jody, should be extremely proud of his ability to maintain a solid crew in the highway, transfer station, park, and maintenance departments, all of which helps keep our community safe and well-kept. Many other towns, villages,

cities, counties have struggled to maintain a full workforce.

Jody was kind enough to leave us with these parting words, "it's been an honor to serve the Westerlo Community in all aspects of my career. I've had the pleasure of working with incredible people who have become friends and have always supported me. I'm glad I was able to help many residents of Westerlo over the years and can only hope that my replacement will carry on what I'm proud to have implemented and accomplished here. It has been fun but I'm looking forward to what's next."

# **Recently Passed and Proposed Local Laws**

Earlier in the year, the Town of Westerlo Assessor proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2024 to change the date of grievance day to Wednesday, May 29<sup>th</sup> as the regular date of May 28<sup>th</sup> was a conflict for her as she is also an Assessor in the Town of Berne. The Town Board passed the Law unanimously to change the 2024 date.

For the last year or more, there has been a lot of discussion regarding a nuisance fence in the hamlet that stands between two neighbors. One of the neighbors has been attending meetings regularly to see if the Town Board could do something to assist him with the issue. Local Law No. 2 of 2024 was finally proposed, to amend Article 12 of the Westerlo Town Code entitled "Supplementary Regulations" and add section 12.130, which will establish rules, regulations, policies and code for the enforcement of the construction and maintenance of Fences throughout the Town of Westerlo. There has been some debate at recent meetings regarding this from both the Town Board and the public. Many people believed it was a matter for the police but in the end, it was passed with a 3-2 vote.

Most recently, near the end of the May 21st Town Board meeting, proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2024 was introduced by Supervisor Kryzak to abolish the Town's Planning Board and transfer its functions to the Zoning Board of Appeals, which is to be known as the "Planning Board/Zoning Board of Appeals". This came as a surprise to most people attending the meeting. The Town Board held a Public Hearing on June 18th to hear residents for or against the proposal. The room was packed, and the Town Board mostly heard opposition from the public, except for Robert Nolan and Joseph Cinque, members of the Town of Coeyman's Planning Board/ZBA who were invited to speak by Mr. Kryzak to explain why combined boards works in Coeyman's. Councilmen Beers and Mahan expressed they were not in favor of abolishing the Planning Board. Supervisor Kryzak provided his reasons for wanting to combine boards such as streamlining the process for applicants and creating cost savings for the Town. The Town Board did not vote on proposed Local Law No. 3 at this meeting as Mr. Kryzak mentioned, he was awaiting a response from Albany County Planning Board on the matter. The Supervisor has since called a Special Town Board meeting on Friday, June 28<sup>th</sup> where he is proposing to pass a resolution to combine boards. Please keep an eye on the website for updates in the meeting minutes.

Permits are required for all town residents and seasonal residents.

# On the Road with the Highway Department

There's not much to report this quarter with the Highway Department, but please note that there is a county road closure. County Route 412 is closed over Hannacroix Creek at the Westerlo Town Line and the intersection of Udell Rd. The road will be closed to all vehicles, including emergency vehicles, however, a signed detour is in place during the closure. The county is not expecting to have the project complete until September 1<sup>st</sup>. Please be sure to plan for an alternate route.

Speaking of veterans, our Westerlo Hometown Heroes Committee, chaired by Councilwoman Amie Burnside is having a stellar year. This year the committee is displaying 90 banners throughout town! There are 22 new veteran banners and 10 new first responder banners. I encourage you to take a drive through Town and view them all! Please save the dates, and plan to attend the banner Closing Ceremony on November 2<sup>nd</sup> at 2pm at the First Baptist Church of Westerlo and the committee's Veterans Day Sunset Service at Veterans Memorial Park.

Finally, our Grant Writer, Lisa DeGroff has been especially busy these past few months securing monies for the Town. She was able to receive a grant of \$1,000 from the Bank of Greene County which assisted in the purchase of a new set of bleachers for the Blaisdell White Memorial Park. She was also successful in securing \$40,000 from Albany County Soil and Water Conservation for the highway department to continue the project of shoring up the banks alongside the Basic Creek in Veterans Memorial Park and on Tan Hollow Road. Lisa secured donations of \$6,000 from Callanan Industries and GNH Lumber for fireworks and additional funds from Carver Companies to hire the band Double Barreled, a rock/country band. The fireworks and the band will be part of an "After Party" at the close of this year's Fall Festival on September 21<sup>st</sup>. The band will begin at 6:30 with fireworks at 8:30. Finally on behalf of Westerlo Hometown Heroes, she reached out to Home Depot for a donation for the installation of a fire pit in Veterans Garden and was successful. Home Depot will be donating the fire pit materials and labor for a total cost of \$1,569.00 Additionally, she was able to secure \$915 from Albany County Veteran Service Bureau for an American Flag Disposal Receptacle for the Town's transfer station. The grand total of successful grants received this quarter is \$50,484.00. Thank you, Lisa, keep up the great work!

#### Westerlo Historical Society Interests include Hannay Reels Tour

Wednesday, May 22, 2024, was a busy day for the Historical Society, beginning with a fascinating tour of the Hannay Reels plant led by President Eric Hannay. Established in 1933 by Clifford B. Hannay and briefly his partner, Ken Morrissey, this plant has been a family-owned mainstay in the town ever since. Morrissey reportedly sold his interests early on for \$250 feeling there was "no future in hose reels", and the business went on to become Clifford B. Hannay & Son. Eric showed us many of the processes from beginning to end, including new technology laser parts manufacturing and robotics. Materials receiving, quality controls, shipping and finishing were just some of the activities we saw up close. What a huge, busy plant!

When the factory tour ended, we were given access to the plant museum, contained in Building #1, the original site of Clifford's activities. It contains a wide range of items relevant to the history of the operation. Many familiar names and faces were displayed, as well as artifacts and documents showing the growth and advancement of the facility. The Hannay family is obviously rightfully very proud of its heritage. Reel #33, built in 1933, was displayed as well as several later evolutions of the reels. They certainly have come a long way! Thousands are now shipped all over the USA and the world.

After our time at the museum, we went to the site of the recently placed historical marker for the "Public Garage" (now Building #3). This building was the site of a dealership run by Orlo Stewart and Gerald De Laverne selling and repairing Chrysler and Plymouth cars as well as Allis Chalmers tractors in the 1930's and 1940's. Lots of happiness and photos celebrated the new marker.

The group then went to the Hometown Deli, the newest eatery in town, for a delicious lunch and comradery.

At 1:00PM, we met at Westerlo Rural Cemetery for the traditional placing of Memorial Day flags on the gravesites of our veterans and continued to Westerlo Central Cemetery and Hannacroix Cemetery to do the same. Flags and flowers were also placed on the memorial sites at Town Hall, South Westerlo and Dormansville.

Finishing in the late afternoon, all in all it was an exciting, proud and memorable day.

The History of Shepard Farm

# **Westerlo History**

The Shepard family that originally hailed from Plainfield, Connecticut, moved to the Greenville area in 1791. It's unclear when the family moved to South Westerlo but by 1854 James Shepard appears on a town map. The original farmhouse was occupied by William and Nancy Shepard and their 4 children, James was their youngest son. In 1859, James died, and the farm passed on to James' nephew, Darwin P. Shepard. Darwin built a new farmhouse on the property which eventually was expanded into the hotel while his grandmother and her sisters occupied the original farmhouse. Upon Darwin's death in 1880, his son Frank took over the farm. Frank's son Augustus took over the farm after Frank.

By the 1920's the farm was struggling financially and the Shepard's opted to rent their house for the summer months "to a few couples looking to escape the New York City summer heat and pollution". The Shepard farm was one of the first resorts that would begin to spring up as the popularity of the area for city visitors grew. Some of these resorts included Ingleside Farm, The Knowlton, Edgewood Farm, Shady Hill Farm House and the Balsam Shade which was also run by the Shepard's until it's sale in 1938.

Augustus was so successful that he expanded his grandfather's farmhouse and property to accommodate a larger number of guests while still running the property as a functioning farm. It functioned as todays "farm to table" experience! By 1925 the resort claimed it could accommodate seventy-five guests! He also added a dance pavilion and space for tennis and lawn games. He also utilized their farm pond for swimming, bathing and canoeing.

Over the years buildings were added and some burned down. Modern electric lighting was added along with powered pumps for two drilled wells along with periodic renovations. They eventually added a movie theater, an inground pool, handball court, baseball diamond and a shuffleboard court.

The resort reached its peak in popularity between the late 1940's and into the early 1960's. In 1957 Augustus Shepard died and likely just his wife Gladys, niece Eleanor R, and her husband Ernest J. Moak became proprietors of the resort. The Moak's would run the resort until it closed in the early 1980's. The property changed hands a few times and currently is found under the ownership of John Dolce and Steve Haaland.

There is a small family cemetery on the west side of Route 32 where three generations of Shepard's are buried. There are eight graves well represented on the property.

# **United Tenants of Albany, Inc. (UTA)**

UTA's Emergency Financial Assistance service assists tenants atrisk of homelessness by directly addressing arrears, utility delinquency, security deposits and/or 1<sup>st</sup> months' rent costs to prevent displacement. This service, in combination with crisis intervention and case management, allows low to middle income tenants in Albany County who are imminently at-risk of eviction and homelessness to stabilize their housing situations, and to avoid the traumatizing loss of their home.

UTA is restricted to provide financial assistance to tenants within Albany County who meet the income limits of 20-80% of the area median income.





# **Caregiver Support Programs**

Caregiver support programs assist informal caregivers – spouses, adult children, other family members, friends and neighbors in their efforts to care for older persons who need help with everyday tasks such as:

- Information, Assistance, and Referral
  - Counseling and Support Groups
    - Caregiver Training
      - Transportation
- Personal Emergency Response Systems\*
  - Short-Term Respite\*

\*These services require an in-home assessment to determine eligibility

# **Department for Aging**

Older residents who are home-bound and in need of day-to-day assistance, including home-delivered meals, should contact Albany County NY Connects.

# **Home Delivered Meals**

The Home-Delivered Meal program provides balanced meals to eligible adults aged 60 or older, and spouse regardless of age, delivered right to their home. The home-delivered meal service may be temporary or long term.

The home-delivered program gives priority to the following target groups who have the greatest economic and social needs: minorities, low-income, frail, and vulnerable elderly aged 60 and older.

- Is incapacitated due to accident, illness, or frailty.
- Lacks support of family, friends, or neighbors; and
- Is unable to prepare meals due to a lack of inadequacy of facilities, such as refrigeration, stove, etc., inability to shop, cook or prepare meals safely, or lack of knowledge or skills.

Our registered dietitian ensures that all meals comply with the Older Americans Act and Nutrition Program Standards. Each balanced meal provides essential nutrients with focus on whole grains, fruits and vegetables, lean proteins, and low-fat dairy. Meals are also limited in sodium, saturated fats, and added sugars. Please be advised that therapeutic/special diets and modified consistencies are not accommodated through this program. Persons that have a known significant food allergy are unable to participate in this program.

The home-delivered meal program provides an opportunity for suggested voluntary contribution toward the service which helps expand services.

Referrals can be made by family, friends, or community agencies.

# **Health Insurance Information and Counseling (HIICAP)**

Through seminars, one-on-one counseling sessions, and the Information & Assistance Line; the Department's HIICAP program provides unbiased information, education, and counseling regarding Medicare (including Part D), New York State EPIC, Long Term Care insurance, and other insurance issues. Trained HIICAP staff and volunteers can help you:

- Compare private insurance plans that will best fit your needs
- Find ways to help you afford coverage and to fill Medicare gaps
- Understand what the 1% per month penalty for late enrollment means for you

## **IN-HOME CONTACT & SUPPORT**

Programs are for seniors who are able to stay in their home unassisted but feel isolated or lack adequate support systems. The programs give seniors a sense of security in knowing that someone will check on their safety or will assist them with weekly grocery shopping.

Friendly Visitor and Shopping Assistance Program
