Westerlo Gives Back

The Westerlo community is nothing short of amazing. Year after year, even with times being as hard as they are for so many, we come together and give to those in need during the holidays.

Holidays can be a time that is difficult for so many reasons. People can be lonely, sad, and depressed. Christmas is expensive. The costs are rising for everything which makes it hard on so many of us. If some of us can come together to make those who struggle a little happier, help them have a better holiday and bring smiles to their faces, why wouldn't we? Thank you to the many donors that showed up for these people this year. The Town of Westerlo once again came through to make a difference in at least twelve people's lives! Yes, twelve people! We were lucky enough to sponsor eight children, three seniors and one veteran this year.

The process sounds simple, but it is chaotic. We enlist the help of the Community Resource Center to provide a list of items for people in need within Westerlo. These people are anonymous with only their first names being provided which allows us to create a box for each of them to fill with gifts in preparation for wrapping. Then we get to work! With donations coming in, the Town Clerk's office starts shopping and getting as many and usually even all the items that were requested, within reason of course. Sometimes we request help from the community to purchase and donate specific items to help us out. Once we have all the items to fill the needs of our recipients, we organize a wrapping party. Some of you who are so generous donating to this cause, also volunteer to help wrap which is a blessing because it can be quite overwhelming with the number of gifts we get. We usually pick a day the week before Christmas and gather in the meeting room at the Town Hall. Each volunteer takes a person's box and wraps until the box is complete. This keeps things organized and makes the process move a bit faster. Once the gifts are wrapped, the Town Clerk makes multiple trips to the Resource Center to deliver the presents for the recipients to pick up. This keeps everything very anonymous.

Over the years, we've received excellent feedback. Seniors have said that they haven't celebrated Christmas or even unwrapped a gift in years. Kids can enjoy a day that they may otherwise not have been able to due to their parent's financial hardships.

In reflecting on this past year, it is exciting to see all that we have accomplished. I am thankful for our Town employees and their commitment to our community. Below are just a few things we can all be proud of.

New finance software - New software was purchased for the Town including the Town Clerk and Tax Collector and Water District. This will update current software to a more municipal friendly platform with ease of use more report options and will integrate better with payroll. In addition, the new software will allow water district users to access their account online as well as pay online with a credit or debit card.

New Server – The Town updated its server which was old and outdated. It was last installed in 2012. The new server will allow for the use of more modern software applications.

Replaced Roof on Justice Court – The entire roof on the justice court has now been replaced. The old roof was leaking in spots and was unable to be repaired. The new roof will help preserve the building for more years to come.

Paved Town Hall, Justice Court, Highway Department – a long overdue project has been completed with newly paved parking lots and striping at all locations.

Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) – The Town Board voted unanimously to approve the addition of accessory dwelling units to be added to properties to help keep families together and parents living close by as they age in place. These units are secondary, independent dwelling units on the same parcel as the primary residence.

New Containers for Transfer Station – New containers replaced the old, rusty containers. A portion of the cost of the containers was refunded through a NYS grant.

Right to Farm Law – The Town Board passed a resolution in support of New York State's and Albany County's Right to Farm Law. The Resolution and existing law's purpose is to maintain and preserve the agricultural traditions of Albany County; to permit the continuation of sound agricultural practices necessary for the operation of farms; to encourage the initiation and expansion of farms and agribusinesses where it is compatible with existing land use regulations; and to promote effective and efficient means to resolve disputes which may arise concerning agricultural practices and farming operations.

Local Law Codification – Local Laws sent to General Code for Codification. This is the start of the process to be able to have all Local Laws codified and posted on the Town's website. Once posted they will be searchable by keyword. This will help residents, contractors and employees with laws right at their fingertips.

Computer and Software Upgrades - Upgraded two computers and upgraded all with the latest Windows 11 software. All devices previously using Windows 10 were exposed to security vulnerabilities.

Tennis and Pickleball Courts – Tennis courts were resurfaced and modified to include one tennis court and two pickleball courts. Each court had new posts and nets installed. The nets will be removed and stored every October and reinstalled

Town Board Change for 2026!

Councilman Joshua Beers graciously served a four-year term on the Town Board from January 1st, 2022, until December 31, 2025. He did not seek re-election for 2026. Councilwoman Lorraine Pecylak who also served from January 1st, 2022, to December 31st, 2025, was also up for election in 2026. She sought re-election for one of two open board seats on November 4th. Previous Highway Superintendent Jody Ostrander and Planning/Zoning Board Chairman William Hall also ran for the two vacancies on the Board. Ultimately, Jody and Bill took the seats joining current members Supervisor Matthew Kryzak, Councilwoman Amie Burnside and Councilman Peter Mahan this year.

Thank you to both Councilman Beers and Councilwoman Pecylak for serving as Board Members for the past 4 years. A lot has taken place over that time. Being a member of the Town Board is certainly no easy feat.

If you see them, please thank Josh and Lorraine for their service and welcome Jody and Bill. Town Board is not a position that many of us want to run for. It can be hard but also rewarding. We hope more people come to meetings in the future and take an interest in these positions that are necessary to run our town.

1. In October, the Town Board acquired a new payroll company for the new year as well as a new website, purchased two new trucks for the highway department, hired Cricket Elderd to the position of CEO/Assessor/PB/ZBA Clerk to replace Claire Marshall, adopted the 2026 budget, approved Nicole Spinnato as a new library trustee, reappointed Sole Assessor Melanie Bunzey, awarded KB Engineering to provide a preliminary engineering report to the Water Board at a total cost of \$19,850.00, the Water Dist. was in need of an income study and G&G Municipal Consulting was awarded the project at a cost of \$7,250.00, and the Town finally passed a resolution to accept the Westerlo Rescue Squad building as a gift. It has yet to be determined what the building will be used for.
2. In November, the Town Board adopted the 2026 Budget, approved the purchase and installation of a new camera at the Town park, discussed the proposal from the union, appointed alternate member Laura Dillon to the PB/ZBA with a term that expired on 12/31/25, and hired a new CEO/Assessor/PB/ZBA Clerk Nicole Grace due to the resignation of Cricket Elderd. Her hours are on page 1 of this newsletter as the hours have changed from the previous clerk. Due to the Town Attorney's retirement on December 30th, 2025, the Town Board advertised for proposals for the vacancy. Two proposals came in. One from Tabner, Ryan, and Keniry, and the second was from a resident, Attorney Andrew Brick who previously served as Town Justice and a member of the Planning Board for Westerlo. The Town also signed a contract for a new printer/copy machine and advertised for a new member of the PB/ZBA due to fact that Chairman William Hall is now a Town Board member. At this time a decision has not been made. The Town Board also discussed and scheduled a public hearing regarding a change to the Town's zoning law regarding signs.
3. In December, the Town Board passed Local Law No. 2 of 2025 to amend the zoning law regarding signs, they passed a resolution to install cameras at the highway garage and court and authorized the Highway Superintendent to order a new gas tank at the highway garage with a 50% deposit up front.
4. Upcoming topics being discussed are GPS trackers and forward and rear facing cameras in the highway vehicles, appointment of a new Town Attorney, and the appointment of a new PB/ZBA Member and/or Chairman.
5. The Organizational meeting will be held on January 6th at 6 pm.

The fall months have been spent archiving items that were donated from the Hiawatha Grange. What is a Grange you ask?

The Grange

National Grange of the Order of Patrons of Husbandry

The grange is a U.S. fraternal organization for farmers and families, founded in 1867 to advance agricultural methods, promote social and economic needs, and advocate for rural interests, notably fighting high railroad rates and monopolies. It's a family focused community group with local chapters (Grange Halls) that foster community, leadership, and civic engagement, supporting initiatives like women's suffrage and temperance while remaining open to all faiths.

Key aspects of the Grange:

History: Established by Oliver Kelley, it grew rapidly in the 1870's as farmers faced financial hardship, becoming a powerful voice for agricultural reform.

Mission: To unite farmers, share knowledge, improve rural life, and advocate for policies beneficial to agriculture and communities.

Structure: Operates with local, state and national levels, with full membership starting at age 14, including programs for children (Junior Grange) and youth.

Activities: Hosts community events, forums, and educational programs; members participate in civic advocacy and community service.

Legacy: Played a significant role in the Populist movement and later progressivism, pushing for reforms like railroad regulation and direct election of senators.

Modern Grange:

Today it continues as a community organization with local halls often serving as community centers for events, arts, and public forums, preserving its agricultural roots while adapting to modern needs.

Here is some History on the Hiawatha Grange:

Hiawatha Grange #1480 was organized on March 24th, 1922, by County Deputy, William Blodgett. There were 34 charter members. The first meetings were held at the hall over Gibbon's store in Dormansville. The first Master, Jesse T. Court, accomplished a great deal and had many plans for the future, before his sudden death. His most important accomplishment was the purchase of the building on the corner of State Route 32 and Silver Creek Road. The building was formerly a tavern and hotel, a stopover for weary travelers from Albany to the Helderbergs, Northern Catskills and West.

For years, an important event was exhibiting in the Altamont Fair. By winning the first prize at the fair 3 years in succession, 1925, 1926, and 1927, a silver cup was awarded. By 1926, the building was paid off.

Membership increased during the thirties. Exhibits were still entered in the Altamont Fair.

In 1944, the second mortgage was paid off. During World War II, the Grange did its part in true patriotic spirit. Several brothers served in the Armed Forces, a number of dances were held to promote the sale of War Stamps and Bonds, and members donated blood to the Red Cross Blood Bank. In 1946, the first Turkey Supper was put on, preceded by a fair displaying a variety of produce and canned goods. (The museum has a poster from one of the Turkey Suppers). Games of various sorts were also enjoyed by the patrons. By 1947, the Grange turned 25 years old. A special celebration was held to celebrate, and a booklet was printed denoting this. (The Museum has copies of this booklet). In 1948, the Junior Grange was organized. A separate room was completed for the children to use for their meetings. Hiawatha Grange continued to exhibit at the Altamont Fair during the 40's.

The 1950's and 60's saw many structural changes to the hall – a fire escape was installed in 1952, running water was installed, and an oil burner was added to the existing furnace. The fall Turkey Suppers and fair was held annually and exhibits at the Altamont Fair continued.

In the 1960's the Grange was 40 years old. New cellar stairs were installed, and improvements were made to the dining room and kitchen. A new roof was put on the south end of the hall in 1964 and a well was drilled. Prior to that, water came from an old dug well. Many community service projects were completed: donations to the Rennselaerville Library and the Westerlo ambulance fund. In 1965, Hiawatha won first prize on the exhibit at the State Fair regarding Empire Livestock Marketing.

The 70's decade saw the annual Turkey suppers continuing. In 1970, the Grange again had an exhibit on Poultry at the State Fair. Exhibits at the Altamont Fair continued, one on Flowers and Gardens winning first prize. By 1971, the Junior Grange was disbanded. The Grange turned 50 in 1972, again with a special celebration and program. (The museum has a copy of this program as well).

Property tax exemption renewal forms were mailed to current recipients in November. If you did not receive your form, please contact the Assessor's office at (518) 797-3111, ext. 1016. All renewal forms and new applications are due no later than March 1, 2026. The Assessor is preparing to update assessments where improvements have been made. A notice of assessment change will be mailed for all parcels that have a change. It's important you are aware of any changes made in the event you don't agree with the change. Grievance hearings will be held on Tuesday, May 25, 2026, if you believe your parcel is not fairly assessed.

WESTERLO HOMETOWN HEROES HONORS VETERANS AND FIRST RESPONDERS



The Westerlo Hometown Heroes Committee held its 8th Annual Hometown Heroes Banner Closing Ceremony in November. The ceremony honors all who have served in the armed forces, our first responders and specifically presents the new current year banner recipients and/or their family members with their banners.

Prior to the banner presentation, this year the committee held a medal award ceremony for two Vietnam Veterans who earned medals they were unaware they were entitled to. Scott Leslie, the Director of Albany County Veteran Services Bureau presented medals to Navy veterans Richard Filkins and Anthony Falese. Both veterans served in Vietnam. Upon accepting his medals Mr. Filkins remarked that he was standing before everyone to “represent the 58,279 U.S. military who were killed in Vietnam, and the 1,582 that are still missing.”

A Congressional Gold Medal of Honor was also presented to Betty Filkins for her father, Charles H. Peck Jr., a WWII veteran. This honor is the highest civilian honor a person can receive. It was also announced that Mr. Peck Jr. was awarded a high school diploma from Voorheesville High School during their awards ceremony in June.

These medals would not have been possible were it not for the efforts of Capital Region volunteer Tom Mullins. Mr. Mullins works to investigate and whenever necessary complete the paperwork for veterans to receive the honors they deserve. For a second year, in addition to the medals, Westerlo announced its Honorary Hometown Hero. This year the committee selected County Executive Daniel P. McCoy. Mr. McCoy was chosen for his eight years of support of Westerlo Hometown Heroes, his 30 years of dedicated service in the National Guard as well as his numerous efforts and programs in Westerlo, including the many grants for Westerlo and the Hilltowns at large.

Approximately 180 guests attended the ceremony. In addition to the medal and banner presentations, Norwich University elite drill team the Shock Platoon participated with bagpipes, presentation and retiring of colors, buglers playing TAPS and the very talented vocalist, Evelyn Lawton. The committee was grateful for Girl Scout troops from Greenville who assisted presenting the banners to recipients. Following the ceremony, guests were served a complimentary dinner of chicken parmesan, penne ala vodka, green beans, salad and dessert.

The Westerlo Hometown Heroes is grateful for the First Baptist Church of Westerlo allowing us to use their facility for the past seven years. Without their generosity, this event wouldn't be the huge success it is.

The 4th Annual Veterans' Day Sunset Service moved inside the pavilion due to the extreme wind and cold. Nonetheless, it was a meaningful ceremony, honoring all who have and are currently serving. Scott Leslie was this year's guest speaker. Pastor Chris Allen gave the opening and closing prayer and vocalist Evelyn Lawton sang the National Anthem and Amazing Grace. Town Supervisor Matt Kryzak closed the program with a few poignant remarks. Many thanks to the Westerlo Volunteer Fire Company members, Auxiliary and Fire Police members for their continued support of this program and their annual attendance.



Beginning in January the committee will begin taking applications for new banners for the 2026 season. Honorees include veterans, past and present, and First Responders past and present. Applicants need to provide proof they currently live in Westerlo or did at some point. Veterans need to provide proof of honorable discharge and First Responders need confirmation from organization officers. Previous banner recipients can also complete a form to have their banner rehung for the 2026 season for only \$20. Placements will be on a first come-first served basis as locations are limited. The committee is also seeking sponsorships for banners and donations in any amount. Some of the families quite prominent in the early history of the village are no longer represented in the population.

A prime example is the Reynolds family. Among the early settlers of Smith's Mills (South Westerlo) was Jared Reynolds, born 1768 in Lower Salem, N.Y. There is no way of knowing the exact year that he arrived, but his wife, the former Hudah Cross, presented him with a son, Lewis, in 1798 at Smith's Mills--a fairly tangible evidence of his presence here.

One other son had been born at Lower Salem NY, Zerah, who later became a medical doctor but died in his early 30s. Old family deeds indicate that the original purchase of the Reynolds farm (more currently known as Colonial Manor) occurred in 1802, but the family may well have occupied before that time the ancient house on the west side of North Street surrounded by evergreens (the home of Mrs. Gladys (Poole) Adriance, widow of Howard Adriance in 1989. This house and adjacent land had apparently been in the possession of the Reynolds family many years when, in 1872, Jared II occupied the house at the time.

Jared II with his wife Delilah Showers, daughter of William Showers, owner of the Showers Tavern (now the church parsonage) lived at that time in what was known as the "Mill House" (NE corner of Main & North Street, home in 1989 of Mrs. Margaret (Boomhower) Bogardus, widow of Charles Bogardus, and in that same year of 1872 he sold his home and about six acres of land lying to the north to Leander Lockwood.

In all probability, Jared then bought from Leander Lockwood and renovated into a hotel the old store building built by Thomas Saxton in the 1820's and known for the later 20th century as the Bogardus Store (in 1989 the post office & 4 quaint shops). Here he ran an establishment known as the Cottage Hotel for over twenty years, offering rooms and meals to commercial travelers, a small line of general merchandise and physical if not spirited uplift at the hotel bar to all who applied. A small bottling plant was operated in the cellar.

A large powerful man he maintained law and order in his establishment by the simple expedient of tossing violators out of the front door. In 1890 he embarked upon another enterprise, the nearby grist mill, which he operated a year or so before his untimely death in 1892. "Jep" as he was known by his friends, had been an integral part of the community for his 55 years.

On a winter day, as you drive by the old Reynolds farm (what was called "Colonial Manor" in the latter 20th century) you will see a small cemetery in the woods to the west. The last member of the Reynolds family to be buried here was Delilah Reynolds, the wife of Jared II. Delilah died in 1916, 24 years after her husband. The cemetery has 23 family members buried here including Jared I, the original settler, as well as William Showers, the tavern owner of South Westerlo.

Easter Egg Hunt/Visit with the Easter Bunny, Fall Festival, Tree Lighting/Visit with Santa and the Grinch, After Party with Fireworks – Once again, the Town sponsored several successful events for the community. Young and old enjoyed

the festive events with new features for each. This year's Fall Festival even saw record attendance. Following the festival the community enjoyed live entertainment with the band The Bluestones followed by fireworks. A portion of each of these events were made possible through generous donations from community businesses.

Defensive Driving Class – The first ever Defensive Driving Class was held this fall with a record number of Westerlo residents attending. Plans are in the works for another class this year.

Wildplay Tickets – With partial funding from Stewarts and the Town of Westerlo residents were able to secure free tickets to Thacher Park's Wild Play. The adventure courses at the park were fun for all age levels. Participants experience making their way from tree to tree by walking across tightropes, climbing up cargo nets, sliding down ziplines, flying through the air on rope swings, leaping onto swinging logs, and balancing on wobbly bridges.

Website Change – Residents will soon see an upgraded and updated Town of Westerlo website as the Town Board approved a measure to create a new site. This measure was initiated by the new requirement that all municipalities secure a .gov or .org website. Since the existing website is a .com, the Town needed to make a change.

Additional Cameral in Veterans Memorial Park - Added an additional camera which was installed at the park for increased security and monitoring for vandalism and other crimes.

New Playground Equipment - Blaisdell White Park – new playground equipment was installed. Veterans Memorial Park – a wheelchair swing was installed.

Engineer for Water District - Hired an engineer for water district to conduct a preliminary report for updates and maintenance.

Zoning Law – Signs - Updated Zoning Law for signs.

Rescue Squad Building - Acquired the former Westerlo Rescue Squad building on County Route 401. Future plans for the building are currently being discussed.

Grants - MVP Fitness Court, Albany County Parks and Recreation, add inclusive and accessible equipment to Town Hall Playground, install a gazebo, Transfer Station for new containers and reimbursement for new truck, Stewarts for WildPlay tickets, Bank of Greene County for Veterans Garden, Town Historian for historical markers, Town Hall playground for accessible and inclusive playground equipment, Callanan and GNH for After Party and fireworks Total for the year - \$265,741.72

A lot of the new updates and purchases were made possible by utilizing awarded grant money and the Capital Projects Reserve Fund. These accomplishments would not be possible without the collaborative efforts of our Town employees and our Town Board. We are also thankful for the generosity of our donors and volunteers. I am confident that 2026 will deliver similar results for Westerlo.

In 1975 a window display could be viewed for Grange Week which continued for 7 years. In 1976, the Gange took part in the 200th birthday celebration of our Country's birth by having a cake float in the Town of Westerlo Parade and in the Albany parade. From 1976-1978, the Grange sponsored trips: bus trips to New York City and Boston, a boat and train trip to Syracuse. Community Service work continued during this time and in 1977 the Grange won first prize at State Grange and honorable mention at National Grange. (Much of the Community Service Projects documentation is at the Museum). 1979 brought Defensive Driving Classes to the Grange for both members and nonmembers. Also in 1979, Hiawatha Grange entered into a contract with the Helderberg Senior Services, Inc. to use the downstairs dining room and kitchen to serve noontime meals to senior citizens.

The 1980's, 90's and 2000's continued with exhibits at the Altamont Fair and Community Service projects.

The Grange and Senior Services closed its doors in 2014, donating some of its artifacts to the Museum.

Thank you to everyone who supported the Chance Auction that was held at the Christmas Tree Lighting event on 12/5 at the Town Hall. The money earned goes to the Museum Carriage House building fund.

Also thank you to all the supporters of Wreaths Across America held on 12/13 at all three cemeteries in the Town. Over 220 veterans were honored during this moving event. This is the sixth year that the veterans in our Town have been honored. Westerlo was among 5,598 locations that participated this year. Special thanks to the New York Patriot Guard Riders, American Legions Riders Post #977, The American Heritage Girls Troop and the Trail Life USA Troop (from the South Westerlo Congregational Church), Dennis (Ding) Boomhower, The Westerlo Fire Police and the Town Highway Department - especially Tiger Mackey.

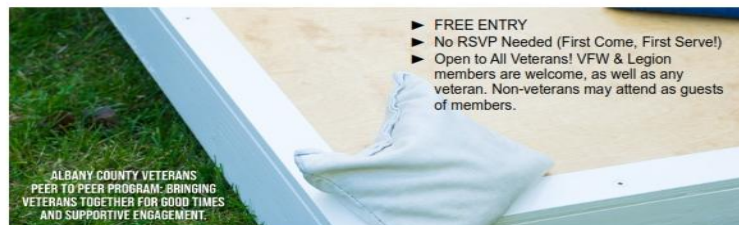

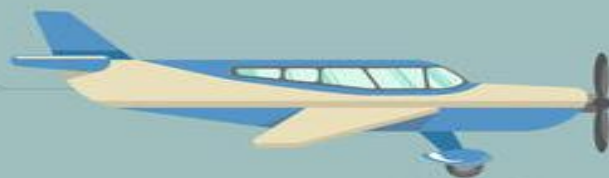

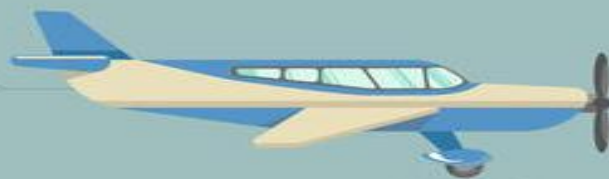
Disposal of Used Motor Oil

Department for Aging

Older residents who are home-bound and in need of day-to-day assistance, including home-delivered meals, should contact Albany County NY Connects.

Home Delivered Meals

The Home-Delivered Meal program provides balanced meals to eligible adults aged 60 or older, and spouse regardless of age, delivered right to their home. The home-delivered meal service may be temporary or long term.

The home-delivered program gives priority to the following target groups who have the greatest economic and social needs: minorities, low-income, frail, and vulnerable elderly aged 60 and older.

- Is incapacitated due to accident, illness, or frailty.
- Lacks support of family, friends, or neighbors; and
- Is unable to prepare meals due to a lack of inadequacy of facilities, such as refrigeration, stove, etc., inability to shop, cook or prepare meals safely, or lack of knowledge or skills.

Our registered dietitian ensures that all meals comply with the Older Americans Act and Nutrition Program Standards. Each balanced meal provides essential nutrients with focus on whole grains, fruits and vegetables, lean proteins, and low-fat dairy. Meals are also limited in sodium, saturated fats, and added sugars. Please be advised that therapeutic/special diets and modified consistencies are not accommodated through this program. Persons that have a known significant food allergy are unable to participate in this program.

The home-delivered meal program provides an opportunity for suggested voluntary contribution toward the service which helps expand services.

Referrals can be made by family, friends, or community agencies.

Health Insurance Information and Counseling (HIICAP)

Through seminars, one-on-one counseling sessions, and the Information & Assistance Line; the Department's HIICAP program provides unbiased information, education, and counseling regarding Medicare (including Part D), New York State EPIC, Long Term Care insurance, and other insurance issues. Trained HIICAP staff and volunteers can help you:

- Compare private insurance plans that will best fit your needs
- Find ways to help you afford coverage and to fill Medicare gaps
- Understand what the 1% per month penalty for late enrollment means for you
- Solve issues and problems with your current plan

Health and Safety

Eat Well: Maintain weight to help with warmth, limit alcohol.

Stay Active: Walk indoors, join virtual classes, or find senior center activities such as bowling or crafting.

Combat SAD: Get some safe outdoor time, maintain social connections, and be aware of symptoms like increased tiredness, appetite changes, or low mood (seasonal affective disorder).

Home Safety: Place CO detectors, keep space heaters 3' from flammable items, and have emergency supplies.

Car Safety: Winterize your vehicle, let someone know your travel plans.
